Georgia's Corn Fritters

The one thing Georgia wanted from us for her 21st birthday was her own recipe book filled with handwritten recipes from Anita. It took quite a few nights of writing (proper cursive - none of this printing or typewritten stuff!) One of the recipes Georgia requested was Anita's recipe for Corn Fritters. They're perfect using leftover corn on the cob (and with summer on the way there'll be plenty of that around!)

Ingredients

2 eggs

1 large dollop sour cream

Either corn cut from 3 large cooked corn cobs or 6 small cobbettes, or

1 x tin sweetcorn, drained (not creamed)

1 tsp salt

1/2 cup self rising flour (you may need more if there's lots of corn come off the cobs!)

Pinch cayenne pepper
Sprinkle chilli flakes
1/4 cup grated cheese
Milk to make thick batter
Rice bran or canola oil
Optional - 1 tbsp chopped fresh
coriander

Method

In a small bowl, whisk eggs and sour cream together and set aside. In another bowl, sift flour, salt, cayenne pepper together, add chilli flakes and grated cheese and mix. If using coriander, add now. Add corn kernels and coat with flour. Add egg mix and sufficient milk to make a thick batter that will hold onto the corn.

Heat oil in an electric frypan (better to control heat) - oil should be deep enough to come slightly up the sides of the fritter. Drop large spoonfuls of mix into hot oil, and cook on a medium heat until bubbles appear on fritter and looking dryish on top. Flip over and cook other side. Place on warm plate with handee towels to absorb excess oil.

Serve with bacon, avocado, tomato and your favourite relish for an awesome Sunday brunch. Also goes well with Sweet Thai Chilli sauce!

Simmo's Tyre Tips

Spring is here now and it's that time of year when it's a good idea to have a look at the boat trailer, garden trailer, caravan tyres etc to assess their condition: whether they are inflated properly, good amount of tread, and not cracked or damaged.

The last thing you need on your holidays is tyres letting you down, so spend 5 minutes and have a good look at them. If you're not sure, bring your trailer in and we can inflate the tyres to the correct pressure and assess condition for you.

Do you have a spare wheel for your trailer? This can be a real problem with older trailers as a lot of the rims used on them are obsolete and extremely difficult to get. But with some forward notice we may be able to help find a spare rim. (Saves getting stranded on the side of the road with no spare!)

With older trailers another good idea is to pull the tyres off and give the rims a birthday sandblast if required, and paint (I've just done wheels on my own trailer). That way they will last a whole lot longer and won't give you issues ie rust flakes causing punctures in tubes. Just bring the wheels in - we can strip them apart and organise blasting and painting too if you like. Call in and see me if you need some help getting this done.
